MEETING MINUTES (#87, by L. Segal)

February 4, 2011

Meeting convened at 9:10 a.m.

Wellhead Protection Plan update: T. Sciacca's sodium descriptive sent to B. Young. K. Tramosch to send selected photos and summary re importance of wellhead protection; also check snow storage at sand pit/high school construction site. L. Segal to send Raytheon & Watertown Dairy hazmat summaries. Pattern of salt buildup could lead to action item to prohibit salt in HH capture zone (HH elementary school & WHS). Plan to include appendix re sodium in capture zone. S. Greenbaum reported that C. Serafinas liked idea of updating SWAP report and thought threats (PSOCs) were on GIS. K. Tramosch to follow up.

Public Education: No response from DPW (Jan. 20) or BoS (Jan 27) on WPC Memos sent re sodium. J. Riley delivered hard copy of 1/20 Memo w/data attachments to S. Calichman who will determine if DPW or BOH should send info to MDPH. Next BoH meeting will be Feb. 8. J. Riley to continue networking with Nancy McShea & M. Hatch on spring program. L. Segal reported website update.

Meeting Minutes: S. Greenbaum motion, K. Tramosch second, voted 5-0 to approve WPC January 5, 2011 meeting minutes.

New Business: Attending Tuesday, February 8 water rate hearing as residents, not WPC member. Town Planner briefly attends meeting. Says no Tighe & Bond hydrology report yet. Rolling Lane residents want flood prevention structures installed before spring thaw; not clear if strategy will work. Geologist will be present during Phase I manhole construction. Drilling rig needed for exploratory groundwater wells to investigate what's happening under clay layer.
